Building in the 4 Corners-The Renaissance

2016/2017 Town Budget Process

The Board of Finance finalized the town budget during the week of March 21. A public hearing on the budget is scheduled on Tuesday, April 5 at 7:00pm at Town Hall in Meeting Room 133. This public hearing is the final opportunity for residents to express their opinions to the Board of Finance. The Board of Finance will finalize the budget the week following the Public Hearing and then present the budget at the Annual Town Meeting on Tuesday, May 3. The Annual Town Meeting sets the official date for the budget referendum which, at present, is tentatively schedule on Tuesday, May 17. The Board of Finance's recommended budget is available on the Town's website.

2016 Remedial Bond Project

The Board of Selectmen held a Special Town Meeting on March 21 to discuss and act upon a resolution setting Tuesday, May 17 for Referendum on the 2016 Remedial Bond Projects in the amount of \$1,905,000. As I have previously reported, when I took office I was informed of a number of projects that town meetings had approved to be paid for by bonding once the projects were completed. These projects were completed during the time frame of approximately 2003 to 2012. It appears that this bonding did not take place or that less was bonded than had been approved. Bond Counsel has approved and agreed that we can bond \$1.905 million of the total \$3.3 million. This Town Meeting allowed us to take the next step to set the date of Referendum to seek approval from residents to do the bonding that was intended originally. Our town remains well capitalized and we plan to continue to build our fund balance in the coming years to maintain our Triple A rating, which allows us to borrow at the most favorable rates.

Social Services News

RENTERS' REBATE FOR ELDERLY or DISABLED

Income-eligible renters who are elderly (65yrs.) or totally disabled (18-64 yrs.) may be eligible for a rebate from the state of CT. Income and housing expenses determine the rebate amount.

What do I need to apply?

- 2015 gross income below \$35,200 if single or \$42,900 if married.
- A copy of your 2015 income tax return (if filed)
- Proof of all income for 2015 including Social Security, pension, V.A. pension, bank interest, stocks, bonds, rental income, etc.
- Proof of all housing expenses paid for 2015 such as: rent, electric, gas, and fuel bills.
- Must have been a Connecticut resident for any 12 months prior to applying.

When and where do I apply?

- April 1 to October 1, 2016 is the filing period.




