Intent to Lien Notices

Real Estate Intent to Lien Notices will be sent out in April for taxes that are still outstanding for the 7-1-2016 and 1-1-2017 billing due dates.

Tax Assessor News

Town Elderly Tax Relief Benefit requirements for the 2016 GRAND LIST (2017/2018 tax bills) are as follows:

- 1. An applicant or their spouse was 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2016.
- 2. A person has resided and paid real estate taxes on their residence located in Brookfield for a period of five years immediately prior to application for tax credit. Applicants must be current on their tax payments.
- 3. The net assessment of an applicant's property shall not exceed the median assessment of \$236,860 for the current 2016 Grand List year.
- 4. A property must be the legal residence of an applicant and occupied by the applicant more than 183 days of each calendar year.
- 5. Applicant income must not exceed \$49,280 unmarried and \$60,060 married. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2016 IRS Form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income. If an applicant is not filing an income tax return, copies of all income statements for 2016 must be submitted with an application.
- 6. Applicant must be the record owner of a property as of October 1, 2016.
- 7. Applications must be filed between February 1 and May 15 annually.

Town Additional Veteran Exemption requirements for the 2017 GRAND LIST (2018/2019 tax bills) are as follows:

- 1. Must have form DD214 Discharge filed with the Town Clerk's Office by September 30 of the Grand List year in which a veteran is applying.
- 2. Veteran must have served during an eligible war period and have been Honorably Discharged.
- 3. Income must not exceed \$52,700 unmarried and \$58,900 married for the calendar year 2016. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2016 IRS form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income.
- 4. Filing period is from February 1 to September 30.

State Elderly Tax Relief Benefit and State Additional Veteran Exemption requirements are as follows:

- 1. Applicants must be the owners and legal residents of Real Property as of October 1 of the filing year. Elderly Tax Relief applicants or their spouse had to be age 65 as of December 31, 2016. There is no age limit for the State Additional Veteran Exemption.
- 2. Income cannot exceed \$35,200 unmarried and \$42,900 married. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2016 IRS form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income. If an applicant is not filing an income tax return, copies of all income statements for 2016 must be submitted with an application.

Brookfield Historical Society



The Brookfield Historical Society will host a talk by author C.D. (Pete) Peterson on Monday, April 3, at 7 p.m. at the Brookfield Museum, 165 Whisconier Road (Junction of Routes 25 and 133) in Brookfield Center, CT.

The multi-media program will present an excerpt and visualization from Peterson's work currently in progress, *After the War.* The program will focus on a child's recollections of life during WWII. Black out drills, rationing, separation, fear, patriotism, and much more are among the memories fixed in those who were children during the war.

Peterson, a longtime resident of Brookfield, enlisted in the Navy and was the second youngest naval aviator (President George H.W. Bush was the youngest). He served on the Carrier USS Wasp. He has been active as a past member of the Town's Board of Finance and was VP of Planning and Marketing at Danbury Hospital. His other works include several business books and the History of Danbury Hospital.
