If you lived in Brookfield as a homeowner, renter, or were temporarily staying with a friend or family member on or before October 1, 2018, your vehicle(s) should be registered in the town of Brookfield. Here are the details: The tax year runs from October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019 for the 2018 grand list year. The key date is where you lived on October 1. If you moved to Brookfield on or before October 1, 2018, you must register your car in Brookfield and pay the 2018 grand list bill to Brookfield.

If you are a property owner and were renting your Brookfield property, please contact your tenants and notify them that they need to have their vehicles registered in Brookfield, or give us their information and we will contact them.

New World Language Lab at Whisconier Provides Real Time Feedback

All Whisconier Middle School students will be able to enhance their Spanish and French education with our new World Language Mobile Lab. This technology platform will improve our teachers' lab instructional time, increasing language classroom use and enabling communication to begin as soon as both students and teachers are logged into the platform.

Students will benefit from being quickly paired up with peers for speaking practice, which will maximize class time. Teachers will be able to record and collect students' work products in one step, review them at any time, and give feedback using text, audio or video. Students also will be able to review their work products with teachers' comments to self-reflect, correct and move forward.

Teachers are able to give students individual attention, and to real-life context by integrating authentic materials including audio, video, text, images and web links.

The inclusion of the World Language Mobile Lab at Whisconier is just one more step on our journey to provide the highest quality education to our Brookfield students.

New School Project Update

The New School Project is now in the Design Development Phase, when details and final design will be developed.

We invite community members to review design details and provide input and feedback to the architect, the Board of Education and the Municipal Building Committee. To support participation, three public engagement forums are scheduled at **Huckleberry Hill Elementary School at 6 p.m. on September 26, October 22, and November 19**. Public Works

The Gas Pump Canopy installation at the Town Garage is substantially complete. It will keep the users dry during inclement weather, and prolong the life of the pumping mechanism and controls.
