Islands Closed on Candlewood Lake

At the request of the towns on the lake, public access to all islands owned by FirstLight Power will be closed until further notice starting this weekend as a precaution to control the spread of COVID-19 and address the large crowds that have been congregating on the islands during the Pandemic.

Town achieves highest Bond Rating

Standard and Poor's has given the town a Triple A rating for debt, their highest rating. They cited "Strong Management", "Strong Budgetary Flexibility" and "Very Strong Liquidity." S&P also rates the town as "above the sovereign," which means they believe our credit rating is higher than the nation's credit rating.

This rating will allow us to borrow at the lowest rates possible.

Connecticut Residents Asked to Report Receipt of any Unsolicited Packages of Seeds

The Connecticut Department of Agriculture and The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station have been notified that several Connecticut residents received unsolicited packages containing seeds that appear to have originated from China. The types of seeds in the packages are unknown, but they may be invasive plant species. The packages may have Chinese writing on them. People in several other states across the country have received unsolicited packages of seeds over the last several days.

Please do not plant these seeds. CT DoAg and CAES ask that anyone who receives an unsolicited package of seeds from China to immediately contact their state plant regulatory officials, Dr. Kirby Stafford at 203-974-8485 (<u>Kirby.Stafford@ct.gov</u>) or Dr. Victoria Smith at 203-974-8474 (**Victoria.Smith@ct.gov**). Please hold on to the seeds and packaging, including the mailing label, until someone contacts you with further instructions.

Invasive species wreak havoc on the environment, displace or destroy native plants and insects and severely damage crops. Taking steps to prevent their introduction is the most effective method of reducing both the risk of invasive species infestations and the cost to control and mitigate those infestations.

United States Census 2020 – It's not too late to complete yours

You should have received in the mail the official 10-minute questionnaire that should be completed by every household. You can respond online at my2020census.gov using the barcode printed on the front of the questionnaire. If you are unable to respond online, complete and mail back your questionnaire. If you need help completing your questionnaire, call toll-free 1-844-330-2020.

Between August 11 and October 31, census takers will interview homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to help make sure everyone is counted. When you respond to the census, your answers are kept anonymous. They are used only to produce statistics. The U.S. Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your answers and keep them strictly confidential. The law ensures that your private information is never published and that your answers cannot be used against you by any government agency or court.

Income and expense reports are due in the Assessor's office by September 1, 2020.

If you are a veteran and have a DD-214 that you have never submitted, please submit it to the Town Clerk by 9/30/20 for exemptions on your taxes for next year. If you have already submitted a DD-214, you do not need to do so again. If your income level is below \$58,900 (married) or \$52,700 (unmarried) you may qualify for an extra Veteran's discount. The DPW will be doing a preventative maintenance process on Secor Road in July called a Fiber Mat. The process should prolong the life of the road for 5-7 years at a relatively low cost.



Assessor's Office, please submit one by 10/1/20. If you have submitted one in the past, you do not need to do so again.

If you have a retrofitted vehicle (maximum of 2), every year on or before October 1 you must complete a new application. If this is the first year you own the vehicle, you will need to attach a copy of the bill of sale for the car and the retrofitting. All applications are on our website.

If you would like to appeal your car taxes, the Board of Assessment Appeals will meet on September 26 from 9 - 11 a.m. at Town Hall. Please see the application and directions on our <u>website</u> to be sure you bring in all necessary documentation.

Brookfield now has a secure absentee ballot drop off box located outside of Town Hall. Absentee ballots can be returned via mail in the enclosed postage paid envelope or in the secure box. You must return your ballots before the close of polls on August 11, 2020.

Tax Collector

The office is closed to the public. We are not accepting cash, but there are several ways you can make your tax payment.

Taxes are payable at Town Hall, 100 Pocono Road or by mail addressed to TAX COLLECTOR, P.O. BOX 508, BROOKFIELD, CT 06804-0508.

The last day to pay taxes is August 3, 2020 without interest penalty.

You can mail us the payment. You may drop it in the drop box outside Town Hall during business hours between 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. You can also use our online option, but please note that we have to use an outside service with a fee for an electronic check (echeck) is 95 cents or 2.95% for a credit card or debit card.

If you mail your payment, it must have a U.S .Postal Service postmark no later than August 3, 2020. Postmarks after that date are considered delinquent.

Failure to receive a bill does not exempt you from the tax or penalty. There is a \$20 service charge for all returned checks.

Renter's Rebate

You can still apply for the rebate through October 1. You must apply every year to receive this benefit. If you turned 65 by December 31, 2019 and your income is below \$37,000 for unmarried and \$45,100 for married individuals, you may qualify. You will need to provide rent and utility receipts for 2019 and a federal tax return (if you have filed one) or all of the tax

Schools

Following State Board of Education guidance to waive the 180-day student attendance requirement, the town board has adopted a 177-day school calendar. This gives the faculty and staff additional work days to prepare for school reopening and accommodating the social distancing requirements. The first day of school will be Tuesday, September 8, 2020 (after Labor Day).

The state Department of Education and the Governor directed local schools to develop plans for:

- reopening school for all students this fall, five days per week
- a hybrid model for 50% of students in school at one time

• a full distance-learning model.

Each plan includes procedures for face coverings, social distancing, cleaning and hygiene, cohorting and transportation. Dr. Barile reiterated that the top concern is the physical and emotional health and safety of our students and staff. <u>School Reopening Preview</u>

<u>Presentation to the BOE (7/15/2020).</u>

As part of the plan, the Board of Finance approved the purchase of 91 laptops to replace aging laptops for teachers at WMS, and 300 Chromebooks for students.

You can read the reopening plan unanimously approved by the board on the <u>website</u>. The plan was developed in conjunction with Brookfield's Director of Public Health and the district's consulting physician. The board will conduct a follow-up survey and schedule Q&A sessions to gauge parents' plans for the school year.
