similarly to a greenhouse. The loosely woven fabrics allow sunlight, oxygen and water to enter the covered area while protecting the turf from cooler or colder weather. Their use improves cold temperature seed germination in the fall and come spring, allows the turf to come out of its winter dormancy weeks earlier, accelerating spring green-up. Parks & Recreation is grateful to the Brookfield Soccer Club for their financial support of this initiative. If as successful as expected, we hope to expand the program onto other grass playing fields in town.



Streetscape Phase Three

CT DOT issued its commitment to fund Streetscape Phase 3 for \$1,350,880, with total project costs estimated to be \$1.5 million. Various departments are reviewing the design and we expect DOT approval this fall. Construction will start in the spring of 2021.

Schools

New School Project


Through collaboration with Tecton Architects, the Board of Education approved the Schematic Design for the new elementary school at its meeting on January 22. Over the

past four months, the Board of Education and Municipal Building Committee have hosted three public forums and facilitated multiple user group meetings, seeking input on designing to effectively implement the educational program. In the user group meetings, classroom, visual & performing arts, special education, and physical education teachers, along with our media specialists, nurses and school administrators have played an integral role in ensuring we have the necessary learning spaces for our students.

The project now enters the Design Development Phase, in which the architects and town-hired construction manager work within the scope of the budget to analyze space use and ensure all program requirements are met, including the recent increase to enrollment projections. The architects will collaborate with the board and committee on the final design of the school, including building materials, energy efficiency, site specifications and fields, as well as public use and access. The town will prepare to bid the project in late fall, with construction beginning in the spring of 2021. The project remains on budget and on schedule.

This project has been a real community effort over the past four years. The board plans to engage with the community, especially students, to name the new school. Some suggestions have already been solicited during the fall public forums. Be on the lookout for more information regarding the naming process!
