Tecton Architects presented the final design for the New School Project to the Board of Education on June 16. The board approved final design development plans and remains on schedule to go out to bid for construction services by December.

The School Reopening Team has submitted recommendations for safely reopening

schools to administrators. The team suggested various instructional models, following current health recommendations and guidelines from national, state and local officials. Administrators will develop a plan following the governor's and Connecticut Department of Education's reopening guidelines. The plan will be reviewed and approved by Dr. Raymond Sullivan, Brookfield's Director of Health.
