Schools

Board Chairperson Rosa Fernandes read a proclamation declaring May 4-8 as Brookfield Teacher Appreciation Week. The board extended warm thanks and appreciation for the incredible job our teachers do every day, especially in the current Distance Learning environment. Fernandes also read a proclamation declaring May 6 as School Nurses Day, and the board extended its wholehearted appreciation to the district's nursing staff for all they do for our students.

Lisa Gramling presented the winners of the 13th Annual HRRA Recycling Billboard/Poster Contest, with 11 towns participating. Brookfield had 135 students participate, with eight of them honored as regional winners. 1st place regional winners received a \$75 check; 2nd place winners \$50 check; and 3rd place \$25 check. This year's theme was "glass" -- how to educate the community about separating glass from other recyclables. Winners were honored in a virtual ceremony on April 22.
