Coronavirus Response: There has been widespread concern on how to address the Coronavirus. # Library

The Art Gallery will feature exotic wildlife photography by Norwalk residents Pat Duncan and Jud Perkins in an exhibit entitled *Feathers, Fins and Scaly Skin,* which will run from March 2-31. The artists will hold a reception on March 15 at 3 p.m.

Erika Haynes, with the Connecticut School Finance Project, presented *School Finance* 101: How Connecticut's School Funding System Impacts the Community, on February 24, in the Brookfield High School Auditorium. Erika regularly presents to boards of Education, Finance and Selectmen, parent and community groups explaining school finance and town, state and federal budgets. Brookfield residents and surrounding community members attended this enlightening presentation.

New School Project Update: With the new school project in the initial stages of the Design Development Phase, the footprint of the building (schematic design) is now established and approved by the Board of Education and Board of Selectmen. The architects, school administration and faculty continue to collaborate to ensure that the interior design is student-centered and aligned with the K-5 curriculum learning plans that have been in development for the past two years. The town-hired construction manager will work with the architects and Municipal Building Committee to ensure the new school is within the scope of the budget, including the recent increase to enrollment projections. We anticipate contractor bidding for the project to begin in late fall 2020, with groundbreaking in the spring of 2021. The project remains on budget and on schedule.
