# The Renaissance Building Application for 763-777

### **Federal Road**

The Inland Wetlands Commission has planned a Site Walk on Saturday, January 9 at 9:30am the proposed Renaissance location at 763-777 Federal Road. Commission Members and the public may attend the site walk. The entire group should stay together. Please do not discuss the site or ask questions during the Site Walk. The Inland Wetlands Commission is also holding a continued Public Hearing on The Renaissance on January 11 at 7:15pm at Town Hall.

The Zoning Commission will hold a continued Public Hearing on the Renaissance on January 14 at 8pm at Town Hall.

#### **Cell Tower**

One of my updates at the January 4 Board of Selectmen Meeting is letting residents know about a Public Informational Meeting that Homeland Towers LLC is having on Wednesday, January 27 at 7:00pm in Meeting Room 133 regarding their proposed Telecommunications Tower on municipal property behind the Brookfield Volunteer Fire Department. Homeland Towers LLC has filed technical information for a proposal for the construction of a tower behind the firehouse that is capable of supporting antennas of multiple wireless telecommunication providers including the Town emergency service providers. This process started a few years ago, and the Board of Selectmen held a Public Hearing on 1/6/14 on the proposed cell tower and lease and residents voted to approve the Option and Ground Lease Agreement at a Special Town Meeting on 2/3/14.

# **Transparency and Accountability**

At the next Board of Selectmen's meeting I will be informing the Selectmen and

public on a change I am making for the way approvals for reimbursements incurred by the First Selectman are approved. At the current time, the Controller of the town approves the First Selectman's expenses. This is a conflict of interest as the Controller works for the First Selectman. For any expenses incurred by the First Selectman, I will ask that those expense invoices be forwarded to the town treasurer for review and approval. This will eliminate any potential conflict of interest.

On the issue of Travel outside the area or that is not in the budget, I will also inform the Selectmen and public that these be pre-approved by the Board of Selectman and that clear and understandable reasons be presented to the board as to why the expense is justified.

The town's budget process will be underway shortly with town departments and agencies submitting their budget requests.

**NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS** 

LAST DAY TO PAY WITHOUT PENALTY FEBRUARY 1, 2016

Payment must be RECEIVED or U.S. POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN February 1,

2016 for the Supplemental Motor Vehicle taxes and the second installment of the Real Estate and Personal Property taxes. If taxes are unpaid by that date, the interest penalty in February will be 3% with a \$2 minimum. Failure to receive a tax bill does not invalidate the tax or interest.

You can make payments online at our website, <a href="www.brookfieldct.gov">www.brookfieldct.gov</a>. Go to Departments, choose Tax Collector and click on link "Pay Taxes/Tax Inquiry". Follow the prompts to make your payment by credit card or e-check. Please note that there is a fee for this service.

To pay in the office, our collection hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday 8:00am-4:00pm and Thursday 8:00am - 6:00pm. Payments methods accepted are cash and checks only.

# Social Services News

CT Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) benefits have been announced for this heating season. Contingency Heating Assistance Program (CHAP) benefits are also available this year for higher income households. Here are the maximum income guidelines for these programs:

Household Size: 1 2 3 4 5 6
Annual income: \$33,132 \$43,327 \$53,521 \$63,716 \$73,910 \$84,105

Households with liquid assets exceeding \$15,000 for homeowners, and \$12,000 for all other households may still be eligible for energy assistance benefits if the annual gross income, combined with the amount of liquid assets over the limit, is

within the income guidelines. Benefits are determined using current annual income for all adults in the household. Benefits are higher for lower income households. This program is designed to assist with heating expenses and will not usually cover all heating costs for the season. Call Brookfield Social Services now for an appointment if you heat with oil or propane.
