# **FEMA News**

**JULY 2018** 

Governor Malloy sent the State application for financial assistance to FEMA in Washington on July 9. FEMA will send its recommendation to the President, who makes the final decision on whether to declare Brookfield and the state a FEMA disaster area. We have been advised to expect an answer by the end of August.

## 2018 Storm Update

We completed cleanup of the town right-of-way, removing 50,000 cubic yards of debris in 19 days. We are in the process of reducing the debris to prepare for transport to a final destination. If you see a pile of roadside debris you think originated in the town right-of-way, please call our Department of Public Works at 203-775-7318. Our town public works crews will be handling ongoing cleanup, so we ask for your patience as they balance their daily responsibilities with storm cleanup. As always, their priority is safety-related issues.

## **Town Trails Still Closed**

Larry Rousseau, the CT DEEP Western District Certified Forester, has agreed to come to Brookfield this month to evaluate the damage in Williams Park and some of the other open spaces with trails, if time permits. He will be evaluating these trails for public safety. There is no cost for his evaluation, which should be completed shortly thereafter.

After his review, we will begin making the trails safe for walking as quickly as we can, but until then please stay away from any trails in wooded areas until they can be made safe. It is safe to walk the trails away from the edges of the woods, in the fields at Burr Farm, Happy Landings and Williams/Gurski Park.

The Greenway is open between the downtown and the Police Station thanks to Lewis Tree Service and Wright Tree Service, who generously donated their time and equipment to make the trail safe. We are working on a plan to clear the rest of the Greenway south of the Police


#### **One Town, One Read**
