Town Budget Process in March

The Town's budget process for 2018 - 2019 is underway. The Board of Selectmen held numerous budget workshop meetings in mid-February deliberating on the First Selectman's recommended budget. The Board of Selectmen finalized its budget and forwarded it to the Board of Finance. A budget presentation is scheduled on Tuesday, March 6 at 7 p.m. at the BHS Media Center.

Strategic Steering Committee Schools Ad Hoc Committee

On Tuesday, March 27 at 7 p.m. in the Brookfield High School Auditorium, The Strategic Steering Committee Schools Ad Hoc Committee, in conjunction with its architects, Tecton Associates, will be presenting its initial findings to the public. Everyone is invited to attend. This is the first of several public forums to be held. This meeting will consist of reviewing initial observations, in addition to listening to community input.

Chapter 168 Parking

The BOS held a public hearing in February and at its regular meeting voted to adopt section 168-2 Restriction on all-night parking and the amended section now reads as: No person shall park any vehicle on any public street or highway for a period of time longer than one hour between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. This section shall not apply to a professional call, vehicles parking in designated parking spaces in the Town Center District, or to the operations of police, fire or other emergency vehicles.

Town Elderly Tax Relief Benefit requirements for the 2017 GRAND LIST (2018/2019 tax bills) are as follows:

- 1. An applicant or their spouse was 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2017.
- 2. A person has resided in and paid real estate taxes on their Brookfield residence for a period of five years immediately prior to application for tax credit.

 Applicants must be current on their tax payments.
- 3. The net assessment of an applicant's property shall not exceed the median assessment of \$237,090 for the current 2017 Grand List year.
- 4. A property must be the legal residence of an applicant and occupied by the applicant more than 183 days of each calendar year.
- 5. Applicant income must not exceed \$49,420 unmarried and \$60,200 married. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2017 IRS Form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income. If an applicant is not filing an income tax return, copies of all income statements for 2017 must be submitted with an application
- 6. Applicant must be the record owner of a property as of October 1, 2017.
- 7. Applications must be filed between February 1 and May 15 annually.

Town Additional Veteran Exemption requirements for the 2018 GRAND LIST (2019/2020 tax bills) are as follows:

- 1. Must have form DD214 Discharge filed with the Town Clerk's Office by September 30 of the Grand List year in which a veteran is applying.
- 2. Veteran must have served during an eligible war period and have been Honorably Discharged.
- 3. Income must not exceed \$52,700 unmarried and \$58,900 married for the calendar year 2017. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2017 IRS form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income.
- 4. Filing period is from February 1 to September 30.

State Elderly Tax Relief Benefit and State Additional Veteran Exemption requirements are as follows:

- 1. Applicants must be the owners and legal residents of Real Property as of October 1 of the filing year. Elderly Tax Relief applicants or their spouse had to be age 65 as of December 31, 2017. There is no age limit for the State Additional Veteran Exemption.
- 2. Income cannot exceed \$35,300 unmarried and \$43,000 married. "Income" is defined as total income from the 2017 IRS form 1040 PLUS Social Security and tax exempt income. If an applicant is not filing an income tax return, copies of all income statements for 2017 must be submitted with an application.

Tax Collector

If you need your 2017 tax payment information, go to the <u>Tax Collector's page</u> on the town <u>website</u>.

Click on the *View or Pay Tax Bills* button. Click on *For All Online Payments and Payment History*. Enter your last name and first initial. (NO punctuation) or you may change the "search by" to whatever you wish. Next click on IRS Payment Records for Year 2017 and then click on Search.

This will bring up the payment records for 2017. Place a check mark in the IRS box located on the right side above the payment information on the blue/green bar and then click on View IRS. This will show the amount of the payment and the date the payment was made. You can print out this information for your records.

Real Estate Bill

If your Real Estate taxes are escrowed, the bank should request your Real Estate bill.

Brookfield Historical Society

Tonight (March 5) at 7:30 p.m. Dr. Gerald Brooker will present a multimedia

program on North Korea based on his trip to that nation.

The presentation will take place at the Brookfield Museum located at 165 Whisconier Road (Junction of Routes 25 and 133) in Brookfield Center

Brooker will share his experiences and show screen photos of his diplomacy visit to North Korea, at the moment a most dangerous country.

Brooker is a renowned author who has published four novels and more than 350 articles and poems, mostly about social issues. He has spent his life as an educator and organizer of humanitarian programs and has been inducted into the National Teachers Hall of Fame. He has given multiple presentations around the world at peace and educational development conferences.

Among his many honors Dr. Brooker received an Award for Outstanding Humanitarian Service from Iona College in 1998, and was also the recipient of the Mahatma Gandhi-Martin Luther King, Jr. Peace Award, in 1997. In 2007 he was bestowed the recognition as an Honorary Iwo Jima Marine by the government of Guam.
