The <u>New School Project Referendum</u> will be Tuesday March 5, 2019 from 6 a.m. - 8 p.m. District 1 voters vote at Huckleberry Hill Elementary School; and District 2 voters vote at Brookfield High School. Property owners, 18 years of age or more and a United States Citizen, with an assessment of not less than \$1,000, pursuant to the property tax assessment provisions of Section 7-6 of the Connecticut General Statues, shall vote at the polling place for the district in which their property is located.
