Board of Selectmen Public Hearing:

The Board of Selectmen has scheduled a Public Hearing prior to the regular BOS meeting on May 2 at 7:00pm in Meeting Room 133. The purpose of this hearing is to receive public comment concerning a proposed Ordinance for Article IV Snow and Ice Removal and Maintenance and Article V Assessment of Benefits for Sidewalk Improvements. The proposed Ordinance pertains to snow removal requirements and enforcement of those requirements, and gives the Selectmen the ability to establish a benefit assessment to be imposed upon abutting property owners for certain improvements in the Town Center District, or any person owning or occupying any lands in the town abutting or fronting a sidewalk. The sidewalk needs to be kept in safe condition and repair for the use of the public and free from obstruction and defects. Annual Town Meeting and FY 2016-2017 Budget Referendum:

Our Annual Town Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 3, at 7:00pm in the Brookfield High School Auditorium. The Board of Finance's final budget recommendation will be reviewed.

The date of the Budget Referendum for the FY 2016-2017 Town and School Operating Budget is recommended for May 17 and will be set at the Annual Town Meeting. The date of the Referendum for the FY 2016-2017 Town and School Capital items is recommended for June 21 and will also be set at the Annual Town Meeting.

2016 Remedial Bond Project:

Please note that at a Special Town Meeting held on March 21, it was voted to have a Referendum on the 2016 Remedial Bond Project on May 17. Besides the vote on the Operating Budget, residents will also vote on the 2016 Remedial Bond Project at the Referendum on May 17.

MOTHER'S DAY 5K:

The Mother's Day 5K is entering its 20th year. This race was originally started to help fund the construction of a new track at the high school. The new track was installed in 1996, which allowed the High School track team to hold their first home meet in over 10 years. Since that time, the track has become a valuable resource for the entire town and is used extensively by many residents.

The race has continued to be held each Mother's Day since and all funds raised go directly to helping maintain the track. Last year, the race was able to pay for all of the new striping on the track. Donations from prior years funded a large portion of the resurfacing of the track after it was damaged during the High School renovation.

Please come out and support your town by running or walking the course. The course is very flat for the most part. Awards, as usual, are for fastest overall finishers and top 3 by age group. There are also awards for the top 3 Mother/Daughter, Mother/Son, Grandmother/Granddaughter and Grandmother/Grandson. Teams must pre-register at Parks and Rec by May 6.

The race will be held on Sunday, May 8 at the Brookfield High School on Longmeadow Hill Road at 9:00am. You can preregister at Parks and Rec at town hall or register on race day. Cost is \$25 through May 6 and \$30 on race day. Please arrive early if you wish to register on Race Day. The first 225 registrants will receive a T Shirt. The race is chip timed.

Our Officers have recently completed training for the use of Narcan, an antidote for Opiate overdose. Each officer will be carrying Narcan with their equipment.

RENTERS' REBATE FOR ELDERLY or DISABLED

Income-eligible renters who are elderly (65yrs.) or totally disabled (18-64 yrs.) may be eligible for a rebate from the state of CT. Income and housing expenses determine the rebate amount.

What do I need to apply?

- 2015 gross income below \$35,200 if single or \$42,900 if married.
- A copy of your 2015 income tax return (if filed)

- Proof of all income for 2015 including Social Security, pension, V.A. pension, bank interest, stocks, bonds, rental income, etc.
- Proof of all housing expenses paid for 2015 such as: rent, electric, gas, and fuel bills.
- Must have been a Connecticut resident for any 12 months prior to applying.

When and where do I apply?

- April 1 to October 1, 2016 is the filing period.

Land Use News

The Town has been approved to receive a Road Safety Audit as part of a Community Connectivity Grant sponsored by the CT DOT. This audit is the first step in the Town's effort to "connect" the Still River Greenway Trail to the walkway and bike path that will be built as part of the Streetscape Project in the Town Center District. Preliminary plans include a pedestrian cross walk on Federal Road.

The Town has contracted with Eversource for a cost estimate to eliminate the utility poles on Federal Road within the bounds of Phase I of the Streetscape Project. The estimate is expected in late July.
