The annual town meeting to discuss the town budget is scheduled at the Brookfield High School auditorium at 7 p.m. on May 1. Also, Tuesday, May 15, is when we've scheduled the town referendum to vote on the 2018 budget at either Brookfield High School or Huckleberry School, depending on your voting location. These are your tax dollars at work, so we hope everyone comes out to vote!

With changing town demographics and aging facilities, the administration and school board are examining the cost and benefits to renovation or

building a new school.

Please provide input by attending the next public forum on June 7 at the Brookfield High School auditorium, when various school project options will be explored, and by participating in forthcoming surveys.

Several repair and renovation projects were completed during the district's April vacation, including the demolition and removal of the vacant portables at HHES, replacement of the gymnasium windows at CES, and relining of water tanks at HHES and WMS.

Brookfield Village has received its certificate of occupancy for both buildings, which means residents and business owners are moving in! Most of the apartments in both buildings have rented. Businesses planning to open this spring include: Subway; an Italian restaurant; a women's clothing store; and Rich Farm Ice Cream. Several other businesses are interested in the area and we will be announcing additional openings in the near future.

Routine spring clean-up continues along the Still River Greenway. We recognize the Greenway is very popular and plan work (when possible) at least disruptive times. We are aware that a large tree was uprooted during a recent storm, but clearing it will require closing a section of the trail for a short period of time. When scheduled, we will post the date and approximate times of closure on the Parks & Recreation website.

The Brookfield Police and Parks & Recreation Departments have posted 911 Location Signs every 600-700 feet along the Greenway. These signs have a location code in large green letters on a white background. Greenway users should take note of the nearest sign and report that code to the Brookfield 911 Dispatcher in case of emergency. Non-emergency issues such as fallen trees and broken pavement can be reported to Parks & Recreation at 203-775-7310 using the location code.

- Public Works crews have been clearing storm drains and repairing curbs and will begin paving roads in May. You can find the paving schedule here.
- The Residential Refuse Center is open Saturdays from 8:30 a.m. 4 p.m. For household items, Brookfield residents can use the New Milford Dump. For more information, go to their website or call 860-355-6044.

Be careful what you click

Cyber security is one of today's hot topics because it's too dangerous to ignore. In January we began training Town Hall employees how to handle suspicious messages and links. You can practice the same steps at home to reduce your risk of becoming a victim of cyber-crime:



- Verify the sender Did you expect to receive an email from the sender?
 Even if the address looks familiar, don't open an attachment or link that you aren't expecting.
- Verify the link Hover over the link with your mouse to show the full url. Does the link match the text? A common phishing tactic is to create a similar but fake link.
- When in doubt, reach out Contact the sender (person or business) to verify the email, but do not use the email address or phone number in the email. Use only verified/listed information. If not, you should verify information by going to a website yourself.

- When you get rid of a car and the plate doesn't transfer to a different car, you are still being taxed on that car. Be sure to contact the Assessor's office whenever you end your lease, sell, total, trade in, junk, donate your car or move out of state. Acceptable forms of proof are listed on the town website.
