Standard and Poor's issues "AAA" Rating on Town

Standard and Poor's has reviewed the town's finances and operations and reaffirmed our "AAA" rating, the highest achievable rating. S&P cited "strong management, strong budgetary performance, very strong liquidity" and a "very strong debt and contingent liability profile" in issuing its opinion. An "AAA" rating ensures that the town will be able to issue debt at the lowest possible cost, saving residents money.

Tree Concerns

The town has set aside \$50,000 in the budget to identify and remove or trim every dangerous tree in town. This project includes storm clean-up and normal annual maintenance. After a complete review of every town street, we are in the process of removing or trimming every dangerous tree, which are marked with an 'x'. The priority is to first remove those trees marked most dangerous, with the rest taken care of as part of work ongoing through the year.

However, the town can only work on trees in the town right-of-way. If a tree is on private property, it is the responsibility of the property owner. If you are not sure if a tree is on private property, please notify the town of the tree in question and we will make the determination. With very limited specific exceptions, the town does not have the legal right to go onto private property.

I encourage anyone who sees a tree they consider dangerous to notify the town, and Public Works will immediately assess the tree. You can inform Public Works by visiting the department, calling 203-775-7318, using the CONTACT US link on the town website, or by sending me a message directly at sdunn@brookfieldct.gov.

When notifying the town, please give as much specific information as possible about the exact location of the tree(s) that is a concern.

Town Center Streetscape Project Updates

Streetscape Phase 2 is in final design review at the state Department of Transportation. All affected property owners have agreed to a right-of-way acquisition plan, and the DOT has accepted the utility relocation plan. We remain on schedule for construction in the summer of 2019. The Board of Selectmen approved a LoTCIP grant application for Streetscape Phase 3 that was submitted to Western CT Council of Governments last week. The DOT held a Public Information meeting on October 29 - this project is state and federally funded and will make significant roadway improvements on Federal Road from the Shop Rite Plaza to State Route 133.
