The Public Hearing notice and proposed Ordinance are on file and available for public inspection in the office of the Town Clerk and the Town's website.

BOARD OF SELECTMEN PUBLIC HEARING -FIREFIGHTERS/AMBULANANCE STIPEND

Prior to the Board of Selectmen Meeting on Wednesday, October 5, the Selectmen scheduled a Public Hearing at 7:15 pm in Meeting Room 133 at Town Hall, to receive public comment and opinion concerning a proposed new ordinance for Chapter 122 Emergency Services Benefit for Certain Emergency Services Volunteers of the Town Code of Ordinances. This new ordinance would replace the current Chapter 197 Taxation Ordinance. The Board of Selectmen would then consider repealing Chapter 197 at the BOS meeting following the Public Hearing if the new Ordinance is approved. The Public Hearing notice and proposed and present Ordinance are on file and available for public inspection in the office of the Town Clerk and the Town's website.

To help the community visualize sidewalk location, pink colored lines and stakes have been placed on the sidewalk edge along the intersection and on both sides of Federal Rd south. These stakes and marks won't be in place for a long time so please do drive by and see for yourself where the placement of the sidewalks will be.

- Current gross income from Social security, pensions, employment, unemployment, interest and dividends.
