is in the process of doing its annual road ratings, which is one tool we use to develop our yearly paving program. The new road ratings will be posted in January 2019.

Town Center Streetscape Project updates:

Streetscape Phase II: This is the portion that connects the Still River Greenway with Phase I, which is complete. The final design review is ongoing with the state Department of Transportation and the project is on track for construction in the summer of 2019.

Streetscape Phase III: The Board of Selectmen have scheduled a special meeting on Thursday, October 11 at 7 p.m. in Meeting Room 209. Approval to apply for the LoTCIP

This will include events sponsored by Brookfield Conservation Commission, The Brookfield Library, Congregational Church of Brookfield, and the Brookfield Craft Center.

Grant Application and a brief presentation of Phase III by Greg Dembowski will follow. Phase III will extend our streetscape design from Phase II down Old Route 7 to Laurel Hill Road. This phase will include another crosswalk, providing safer access to the Still River Greenway Trail and other amenities.

Lower Federal Road Streetscape: This project will upgrade four intersections and add turning lanes between Shop Rite Plaza and Barnbeck Place on Federal Road. There will be a Public Information meeting about this project on October 29 at 7 p.m. in room 133 at Town Hall.

Brookfield CARES


