This is to request funding, through the Police Outside Services Fund, for the hiring of a consultant to evaluate the potential capital purchase of an upgrade or replacement to the town-wide emergency radio system. This purchase, through the OSF, is authorized as outlined in the Policy approved by the Brookfield Board of Selectmen on December 3, 2012.					
BACKGROUND: The existing town-wide emergency radio system, utilized by Police, Public Works, Vol. Fire and EMS services in the town, is at end of useful service life and must be upgraded or replaced. The last upgrade to this system was in made in 2006-7. Technology and the interoperability needs of the supported emergency services of Brookfield have changed dramatically in the years since the last upgrade. Options to bring the Brookfield Emergency Radio System up to date and make it resilient as well as interoperable with state and regional systems are complex and require a degree of expertise not available from Brookfield staff. A well-qualified consultant, with a knowledge of Connecticut specific emergency radio communications operations, must be hired to guide the town in this upgrade and purchase process.
