VAMS appointments preferred. Will accept walk-ins. Proof of primary vaccine series must be presented at vaccine clinic.

Booster dose recommendations:

Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 Booster Doses:

- People 65 years and older and residents in long-term care settings should receive a booster Covid-19 vaccine of at least 6 months after their primary series.
- People aged 50–64 years with <u>underlying medical conditions</u> should receive a booster vaccine at least 6 months after their primary series.
- People aged 18–49 years with <u>underlying medical conditions</u> may receive a booster Covid-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their primary series, based on their individual benefits and risks.
- People aged 18-64 years who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting may receive a booster COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months after their primary series, based on their individual benefits and risks.

J & J COVID-19 Booster Doses:

VRBPAC & FDA voted unanimously to recommend authorization of a booster dose of the J&J vaccine for everyone 18 and older who got the primary dose of J&J COVID vaccine at least 2 months ago.

^{**} Important to note that the booster dose for the Pfizer vaccine is the same dosage as the primary series. The booster dose for the Moderna vaccine is half the dose of the primary series. Mixing and Matching vaccines for the booster dose after a primary series is permitted.
