Now that the holidays are behind us, we expect a gradual slowing of COVID-19 cases reported by the State. There has been some improvement this past week with 117 reported cases compared to 169 the week before <u>Connecticut Data</u>. When one looks at the overall percentage of confirmed town cases, the number of townspeople affected continues to remain very low.
