Fortunately, COVID-19 cases reported by the state continue to decline with state positivity below 7%. There is continued marked improvement this past week with 36 reported cases compared to 47 the week before <u>Connecticut Data</u>. This means 99.79% of Brookfield's population is presumed healthy (without Covid infection).
