WHEN TO APPLY: Overseas voting forms will be available at the office of the Town Clerk for a period ending at 8 P.M. on the day of the election or primary, and beginning as follows:

45th day before a general election 30th day before a primary or special election

Applications for such forms may be submitted before these periods, but the forms will not be mailed until the appropriate period begins.

WHO MAY USE THIS FORM: Because of Conn. Gen. Stats. Secs. 9-158a to 158m and the Federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (42 U.S.C. 1973 ff), certain persons described below will be eligible to vote for candidates for electors of President and Vice-President, member of the United States Senate, and member of the United States House of Representatives in the town in this state in which such person formerly resided immediately prior to his departure from the United States.

Any such person wishing to vote in a federal election may do so only by means of a paper "Overseas Ballot". You may obtain such a ballot by filing this application with the appropriate Town Clerk.

You will be eligible to vote in this way - and in no other way - if you have not forfeited your electoral rights and privileges because of a disfranchising crime, or are eligible to have such privileges restored pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stats. Sec. 9-46a and you are a citizen of the United States who is at least 18 years of age, who resides outside the United States, and who - immediately prior to moving outside the United States - was a bona fide resident of a town in this state, who is not registered to vote, and is not voting in any other state or election district of a state or territory or in any territory or possession of the United States; and who has a valid passport or card of identity and registration issued under the authority of the Secretary of State of the United States or alternative form of identification.

[a] PERSONS ARE GUILTY OF FALSE STATEMENT IN ABSENTEE BALLOTING when they intentionally make a false written statement on, or sign the name of another person to, the application for overseas voting forms. (Sec. 9-1581, 9-359a) [b] False statement in absentee balloting is a class D felony. (Sec. 9-359a) [c] A SENTENCE for a class D felony shall be at least one year but may not exceed five years in prison. (Sec. 53a-35a) [d] A FINE for the conviction of a class D felony shall not exceed five thousand dollars. (Sec. 53a-41)

NOTES: 1. Return the completed application to your town clerk. If your town clerk has a fax machine, you may fax this application to the clerk but must also mail this completed application with your original signature to the clerk, either separately or with your overseas ballot. If your application with your original signature is not received by the close of polls on the day of the election or primary, your overseas ballot will not be counted.

2. If you received an overseas ballot without filling a Federal Post Card Application or this application form, your overseas ballot will not be counted unless the Federal Post Card Application or this completed application form is received by your town clerk prior to the election or primary. Please return the completed Application in a separate envelope from the overseas ballot.
