Renter's Rebate

Filing period is April 1 - October 1. If you rented in 2021, were age 65 or older or disabled and your income (including Social Security) was no more than \$38,100 for individuals and \$46,400 for couples, you may be eligible to receive a Rebate from the State. Help for Homeowners!

A new CT homeowners' assistance program has been created using monies from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). It is called **MyHomeCT**, and is available to eligible CT residents who have mortgage **delinquencies or defaults that occurred as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic**. The CT Department of Housing is the responsible entity for the program and has designated the CT Housing Finance Authority (CHFA) to administer it on its behalf. Mortgage and non-mortgage grants are awarded to eligible homeowners as either **one-time assistance**, which brings the homeowner's bills current, or as **ongoing assistance** to pay bills going forward (up to 12 months). Non-mortgage assistance includes, but is not limited to non-mortgaged real estate taxes and insurance, condominium or HOA fees, water and sewer liens, HOA or condominium assessments.

CTpathways SNAP Employment and Training Program

SNAP E&T is a work program designed to help SNAP recipients gain skills that will help increase self-sufficiency.

If you are receiving SNAP in Connecticut and not receiving money from the Temporary Family Assistance (TFA) program, you may be eligible to participate in SNAP E&T. E&T is a skills-based program that provides short- term vocational programs at community colleges and community-based organizations.

CONNECTICUT BUSES FARE-FREE THROUGH November 30, 2022

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) announced today that all public transit buses will be fare-free across Connecticut from April 1, 2022 through November 30, 2022.

"With the recent rise in fuel prices and increased costs associated with owning and maintaining private vehicles, it is important to provide meaningful relief to the residents of our state," stated CTDOT Commissioner Joseph Giulietti. "We are excited that people are returning to our services again or are trying us out for the first time."

Fare free buses were included in recent policy signed by Governor Lamont. Policy also includes a three-month waiver of .25 cents to the state's gasoline tax, and a sales-tax free week in mid-April on clothing and shoes under \$100.

"As the pandemic recedes, many people are now returning to workplaces either full-time or with a hybrid schedule, and as a result, increasing the traffic volume on our state's roadways," said CTDOT Bureau Chief for Public Transportation Rich Andreski. "Going fare-free for three months will benefit all riders of the bus system and hopefully entice more people to give the bus a try."

On-demand bus services operating in Norwalk and Westport as Wheels2U, in Stonington as Hop and in the Estuary region as XtraMile, are premium services that are not included in the fare-free promotion. Interstate bus services such as Greyhound and Peter Pan are also not included.
